Ye, that at the Village of Johnstown, in the County of Montgomery, on the
nineteenth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand eight
hundred and twenty seven, before Tobias A. Forsterburgh, Esquire, Surrogate
of our said County, the last Will and testament of Richard Horning deceased,
(a copy whereof is herewith annexed) was proved, and is now approved and allowed
of us: and the said deceased having whilst he lived, and at the time of his death,
goods, chattels or credits within this State, by means whereof the proving and
executing the said will, and granting Administrations of all and singular the said
goods, chattels and credits, and also the auditing, allowing and final discharging the
accounts thereof doth belong unto us: the administration of all and singular the
goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, and any way concerning his will, is granted
unto Edward M. Mahardt an Esquire in the said Will named, he being first duly
sworn, well and faithfully to administer the same, and to make and exhibit a true and
perfect inventory of all and singular the said goods, chattels and credits, and also to render
a just and true account thereof, when thereunto required. The testimony whereof,
we have caused the seal of office of our said Surrogate to be hereunto affixed. Witness

First I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catherine
 Horning all my personal property & moveables of every description
 whatsoever & all debts of any due to me, and also the farm I bought
 of William Smith adjoining the farm of Ganet W. Mahodt in Longkone
 appraised containing about one hundred & five acres to have to hold
 the same to the said Catherine Mahodt my said wife for her
 said apprais price and to be disposed of as she shall think fit. Item
 I give devise and bequeath unto my nephew Richard R. Horning
 who now lives with me the farm on which I now live, containing about
 one hundred and sixteen acres; to have and to hold the same to him & his
 heirs forever. Lastly I do hereby nominate & appoint the sons of my
 wife Ganet W. Mahodt and Abraham Mahodt to be executors of this
 my last will and testament hereby revoking all former wills by me
