

## Record of the will and probate thing of Peter Mahrad deceased

I Peter Mahrad of Cavanaugh in the County of Montgomery do make, publish and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form following. First I give and bequeath to my son Mearse all my farming utensils and all other things which I left with him and five dollars in money 2<sup>nd</sup>. I give and bequeath to my son William my clock stove and pipe - 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Lavin my three square clover - 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Catharina all my household furniture and all my other personal property which I have not given away - 5<sup>th</sup> I further order and advise that after my death that whatever property my wife does not want that she should divide it between my two daughters - 6<sup>th</sup> I order that all my lawful debts should be paid out of my estate and my funeral charges - 7<sup>th</sup> I do appoint my wife Mary Catharina Peter Mahrad Jr. and William Lavin all of the town of Cavanaugh and County of Montgomery Executors of this my last will and testament. In witness I hereunto set my hand and seal this 25 day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one.

Be it remembered that as a Juror's Court held for the said County of Montgomery, at the Juror's Office in the Village of Pleasanton in the said County, before Tobias A. Stoutenburgh Juror of the said County on this nineteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one the last will and testament of Peter Mahrad late of the said County deceased (a copy whereof is hereto annexed) was admitted to probate by the said Juror, after a citation to the widow and next of kin to the said decedent, issued, served, returned and filed according to law, and also after due and satisfactory proof having first been made of the circumstances of the execution delivery and possession of the said will. Whereupon as the plan and on the day aforesaid Robert Bowman being present and duly sworn by the said Juror, testified that he saw the said Peter Mahrad seal and execute the instrument shown unto him while said instrument purports to be the last will and testament of the said Peter Mahrad deceased and bears date the twenty sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty one that he heard the said Peter Mahrad publish and declare the same as and for his last will and testament, that at the time being the said Peter Mahrad was of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding to the best of his knowledge and belief that he subscribed his name to the said will as a witness to the execution thereof, in the presence of and at the request of the said testator, and that he at the same time saw Suppence Seiber and Thomas P. Hammond the other witnesses to said will subscribe their names thereto as witnesses to the execution thereof in the presence of and at the request of the said testator. Whereupon the said Juror upon the proof aforesaid, being satisfied of the genuineness and validity of the said will, order that the same be admitted to probate and that letters testamentary thereon be granted after the expiration of thirty days.
