Grantors: Gerhard Walrath, blacksmith, and Anna his wife, of the Town of Canojohary County of Montgomery


Grantee: Peter Walradt, Town of Canojohary County of Montgomery

Consideration: 265 pounds

Description of land: All that certain Lot of land situate lying and being on the South side of the Mohawk river at Canojohary aforesaid being part of a tract of land called Otsquago (sp?) granted by letters patent to Rutger Bleeker, Nicholas Bleeker and others distinguished in the division thereof made on the last day of October 1739 by the name of Lot number five beginning at the Southwest corner of Lot number four running from thence South seventy five degrees thirty minutes West nineteen chains and fifty links then North fourteen degrees and thirty minutes West fifty two chains, thence South seventy five degrees and thirty minutes East nineteen chains and fifty links, thence South fourteen degrees and thirty minutes East fifty two chains to the place of beginning containing one hundred and one acres one rood and twenty perches of land.

Witnessed by Jacob G. Klock, Judge of the Court of Common Pleas for the County of Montgomery on March 14, 1792

Note: There is a discrepancy with the dates of recording and witness. It is unlikely that the deed would have been recorded prior to witness by the judge.
