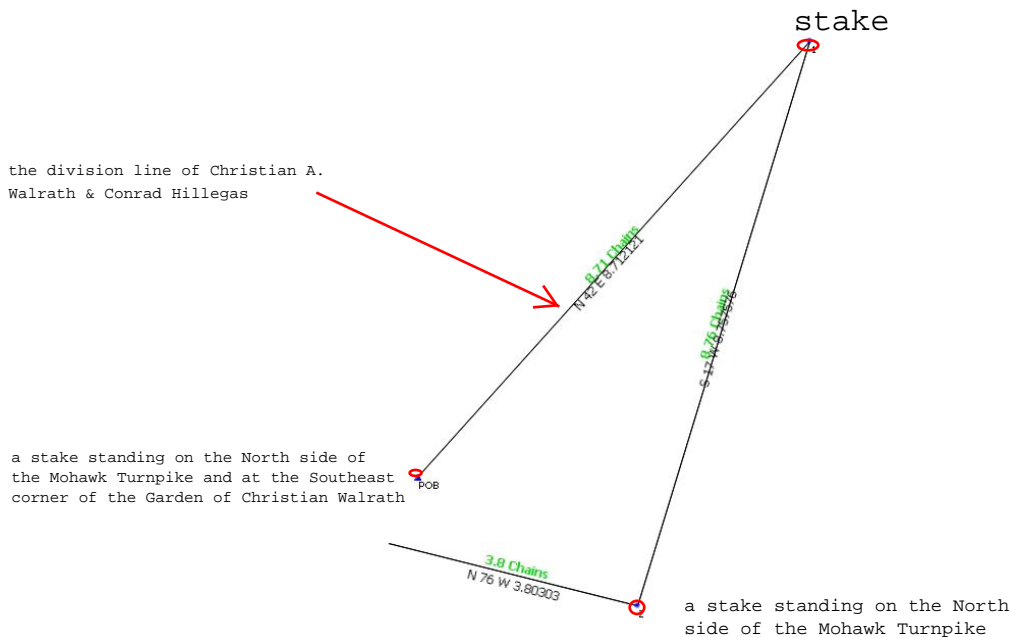
Grantee: Christian A. & Catherine Walrath, Oppenheim, Montgomery Co., N.Y.

Description of land: Part of Lot 18, in Oppenheim, in the Patent granted to Francis Harrison, Lewis Morris, Jun & others, beginning at a stake standing on the North side of the Mohawk Turnpike and at the Southeast corner of the Garden of the said Christian Walrath and from there North along the division line of the said Christian A. Walrath & said Conrad Hillegas 42 degrees East 8 chains & 70 links to a stake then South 17 degrees West 8 chains & 75 links to a stake standing on the North side of the Mohawk Turnpike then North 76 degrees West 3 chains & 80 links to the place of beginning containing 1 acre 2 roods & 25 perches.

Note: The wife of Christian A. Walrath, was a daughter of Conrad Hillegas. They are named in the 1828 Petition. Christian was a son of Adam Walrath & Magdalena Klock. In the 1828 Petition, Catherine Hillegas and her siblings were heirs although their mother, Annet, a daughter of Adolf Walrath (died 1783), was deceased. The marriage of Annet & Conrad is recorded in the Dutch Reformed Church, German Flatts, Herkimer County. Since this deed was executed in 1830, Sopia Hillegas must have been the second wife of Conrad.
