

His Indenture, made this twenty seventh day of Feb-
ruary Eighteen hundred and fifty six. Between Harvey Wick of the
first part And Stephen C. Walcott of the second part - Witnesseth that
the party of the first part for the consideration of Four dollars to him
^{in hand} paid has and by these presents does grant, sell and convey unto
the party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns, the one half
being being the south Easterly half of the superior parcel of land
situate in the village of Fort Plain Montgomery ^{county} and in the enclosure
of Fort Plain village ^{survey} ground & known as lot number thirty three
reference being had to a map of said ground in the Clerk's office of said
village to be used for the purposes of interments by the said party of the second
part and his heirs and assigns forever ^{subject} to the present and future by laws
of the said village and subject to the direction and control of the trustees
of said village. On Witness whereof the party of the first, has hereunto
set his hand and seal this day and year first above written.
